The Stonnall Neighbourhood Plan was made in 2016 having been informed by a 2014 survey. This 2024 survey seeks to understand whether and how the community's views have changed on the main issues. The views expressed in 2014 were not specific to any individual but represented the prevailing view of the community at that time.

<p>1. In 2014 the community told us that it valued the quietness of the village and easy access to the countryside. It was also identified that the loss of historic buildings could destroy the identity of the village and residents wanted to see the preservation and retention of the village character, buildings and features.</p>
